Concept Connections

Gifted students thrive on making connections. Use this strategy as flexibility for them to make connections in conceptual connections.

- In math, how would a student visually represent patterning, long division or polynomials?
- In science, how would a student visually represent global warming or chemical changes?
- In social studies, how would a student visually represent peace and war?

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Visual Story Creation	This is a strong inclusive strategy that can reach the diversities within your classroom. English Language Learning students can embrace this visual story creation. Gifted students thrive on thinking with flexibility. With each image selected by the student, there is the 'why' behind the choice therefore validating their chosen image.	
Promotes Communication	Depending on the class environment and task, the Colouring Curiosity promotes discussion both for the observer and the creator. Partner sharing or group discussions can be purposely planned.	
Self Empowerment	This isn't a recipe to follow. It is a great example of a guide to follow that results in something uniquely personal.
